March 15<sup>th</sup> marks one year from the press release of the first PCR positive case of the virus which causes COVID. Within 2 weeks we will likely reach 5000 cases and 200 deaths in Franklin. In that year many of us have learned about virology and immunology in ways we never imagined. We know the functional meaning of PCR, Corona, spike protein, antigen testing, monoclonal antibodies, replication rates, the list goes on.


